Writing activity relating to the animals/insects in *Seasons* Theatre Show

## **Activity Outline**

Ask your class to make a mind map of all the animals that appear in Seasons. Sort the animals into seasons. Make a mind map of other things that stand out in certain seasons and add that to the mind map.

Share the poem structure with the class:

What season can it be? I looked outside the window and what did I see? \_\_\_, looking at me. What season can it be?

- Co-construct a poem together
- Children then create a poem of their own for their favourite season
- Share with each other to see if they can answer the question.
- Presenting the poems in groups

Use a variety of musical instruments to accompany the poem - turn it into a song to present to others. Children can make up own rhythm or work together as a whole class to do this.



#### Outcome

- The children will be able to create a clue for the season so that others can guess what season it is. If the audience can guess then they are successful
- Present to an audience with backing musical instruments and singing the poem
